

Are main and backup cables separated in cable trays





Overview

Answer: Yes; cables are tied down in cable trays to keep the cables in the cable tray, to maintain spacing between cables, or to segregate or confine certain types of cables to specific locations. When completely installed, without damage either to conductors or structural system use maintain spacing or to keep cables in place when the tray is bent the minimum bend radius for cables as they exit the bottom of the cable tray. 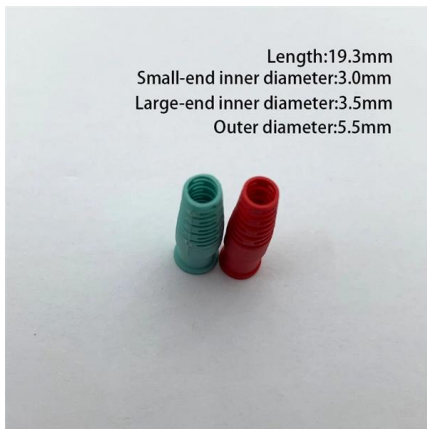
