All TBBs must be tied to the telecommunications main grounding busbar (TMGB) located in the equipment room (or main telecommunications room). The TMGB must be bonded to the building

If the current flows across a piece of equipment, damage may occur. That means all equipment and all metal materials including racks, cabinets, other enclosures, and ladder racks/cable

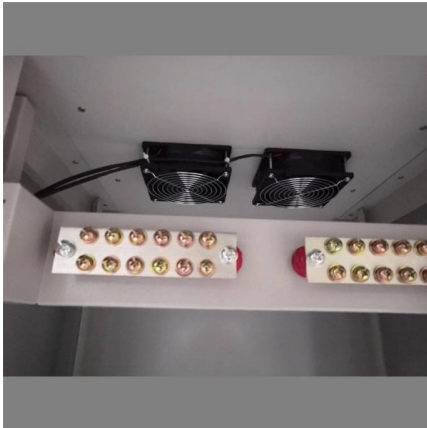
