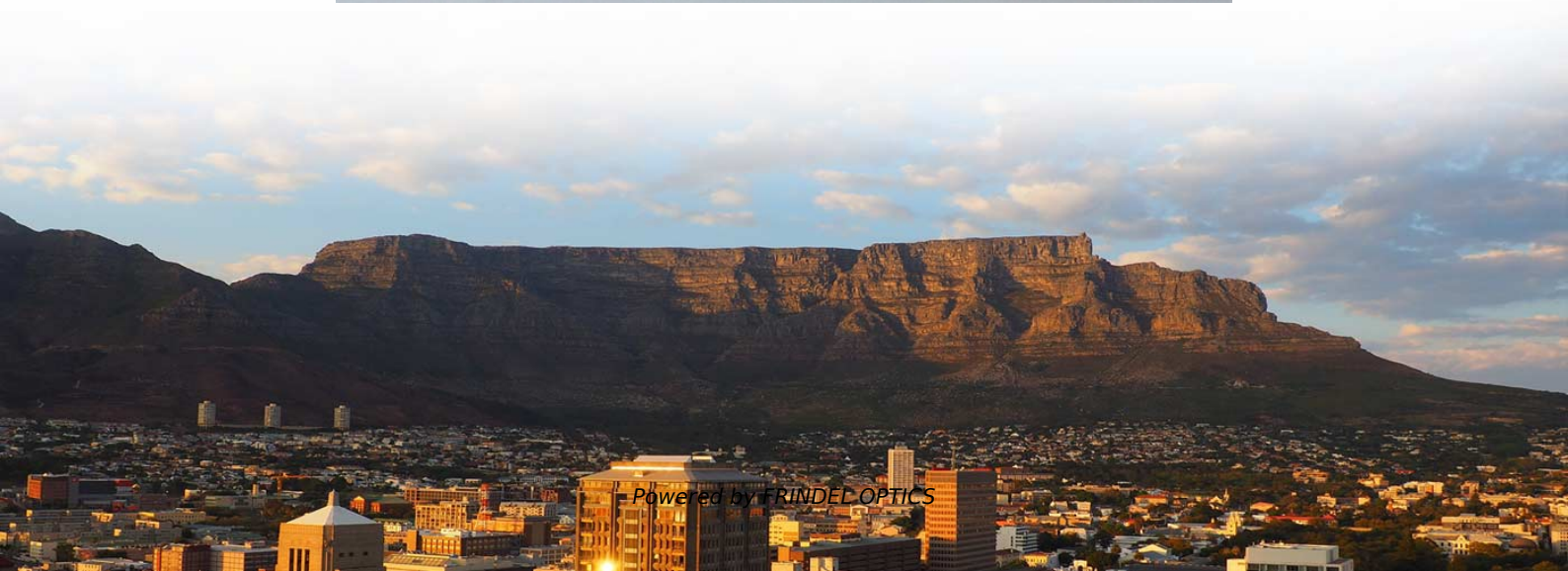

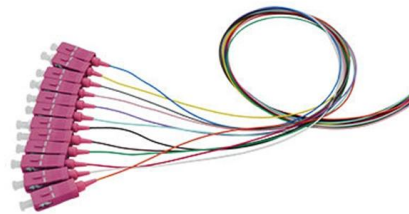
Fire Alarm Wiring Based on NEC Article 760

Power-limited fire alarm circuits and audio system circuits using Class 2 and Class 3 wiring methods shall not be installed in the same raceway, enclosure, cable routing assembly or cable tray.

To determine the correct wire gauge to use on one circuit, the following information is required: The quantity, voltage and current draw of all lock(s) and other powered devices on one circuit.



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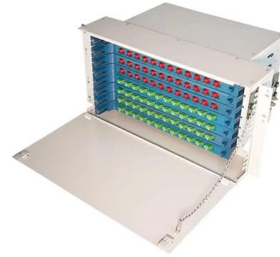
