Overview

Installing a residual current device (RCD) in your ABB distribution board is relatively simple if you're a bit tech-savvy. A Residual Current Breaker with Overcurrent Protection (RCBO) is a protective device that safeguards electric circuits and appliances from both short circuits/overcurrents and leakage/earth faults. It incorporates features of both Miniature Circuit Breakers (MCBs) and Residual Current Devices (RCDs). Therefore, an RCD exposed to such waveforms needs to be of a suitable type, otherwise a distorted. Always follow a step-by-step approach, use the appropriate tools, and understand the wiring plan thoroughly.

Residual alternating currents superimposed on a smooth direct current of up to 0.4 times the rated residual current (I_n) or 10 mA, whichever is the highest value.

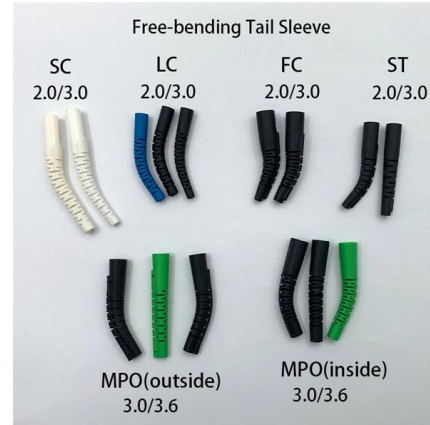
