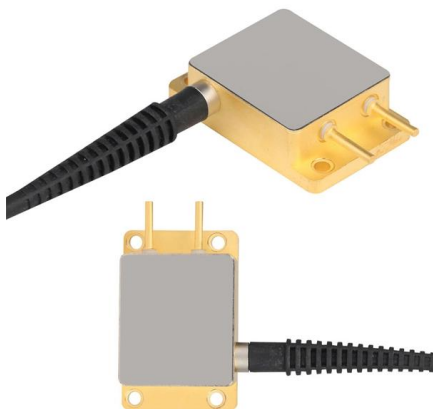
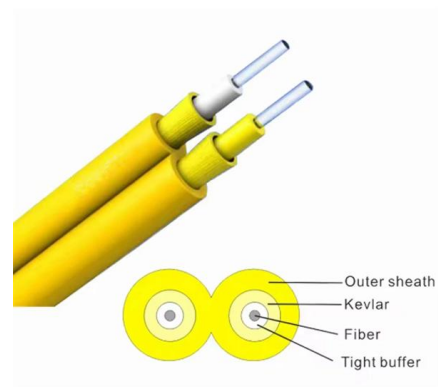
In the core stack I will connect one NIC from each server into each switch - making the core redundant for those servers - if one core switch fails I

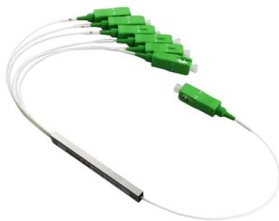

I would recommend at least 2 copper runs per switch, which you can then put in a port channel, so that you have 2 Gbps of uplink for all of your edge switches. If you are planning on just

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Connecting Server to the core

You might have two cores so the access switch can take a failure on the core. The server might talk to other servers on the same switch.

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Core Switch for servers

Similar to what you are wanting to do, I have all of our server appliances and access switches redundantly uplinked into both core switches for full redundancy.
